MC GIVES! CalKIDS MAKE AN IMPACT WITH END OF YEAR GIVING

Bright Futures is proud to share that Monterey County currently ranks second in the entire state for the percentage of CalKIDS accounts claimed. We are honored to be selected once again for Monterey County Gives!, and we remain deeply grateful to the donors who helped raise more than \$17,000 in last year's campaign.

Because of your generosity, Bright Futures expanded essential CalKIDS outreach across the county, including hiring paid interns who supported families with account activation. This work helped increase student claims from 15% in November 2024 to 29% today, resulting in more than \$10.8 million claimed for Monterey County students.

COMMUNITY SCHOOLS SYMPOSIUM MONTEREY COUNTY

CALIFORNIA CRADLE TO CAREER COALITION RETREAT

Over two days in Modesto, Cradle to Career Coalition partners came together to align on a shared 2026 policy agenda and strengthen long-term collaboration. Day 1 focused on grounding in StriveTogether's statewide context, outlining the key elements of the policy agenda, and analyzing the forces that will help or hinder implementation.

Day 2 centered on preparing for the upcoming legislative session, reflecting on last year's progress, and defining clear roles, commitments, and next steps. The retreat strengthened alignment across regions, built momentum, and set the foundation for a coordinated policy effort in 2026.
